## The new DNA scheme in disputed Child Arrangements Order cases – effective immediately

We are writing to draw your attention to this new provision, which came into effect last week. We suggest you read and absorb the information, available on the Cafcass website at the links below, about how the new provision and procedure will operate.

This service arose out of concern that too many finding of fact hearings were being convened because courts could not order a DNA test to determine paternity. The new service is intended only for those cases where the case turns on the need for a DNA test to establish paternity. Establishing true parentage is important for children, hence we want to emphasise the importance of this new service for these children. However, if a dispute can be resolved in another way between the parties, this may be preferable to testing.

The service is being funded from existing budgets. At this stage, funding for the service in England and Wales is secured for the next 12 months only. It is in the common interest, including that of children, for the provision and resource to be used both sparingly and appropriately, to ensure the service has the best possible chance of being sustainable in future years.
